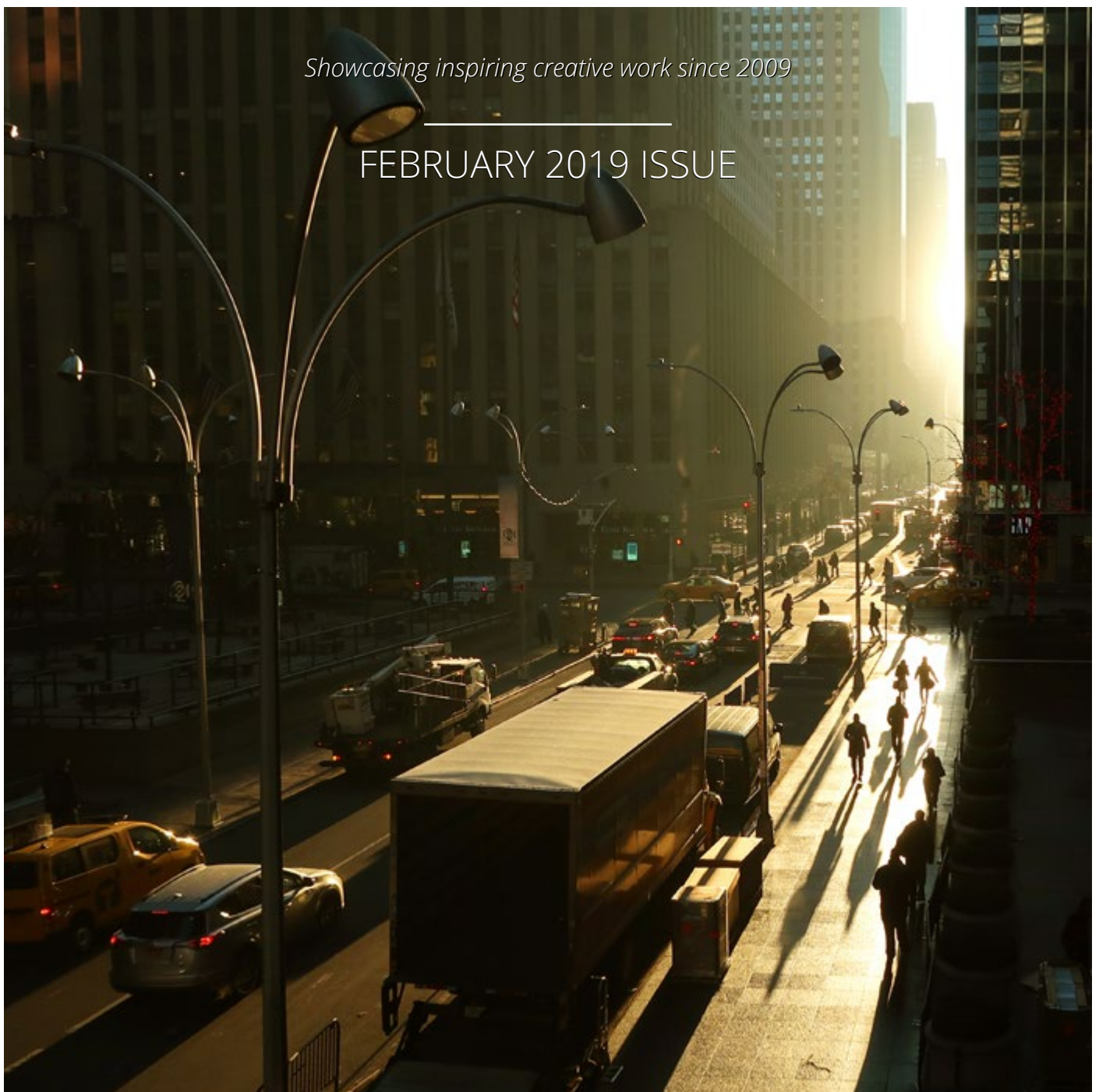

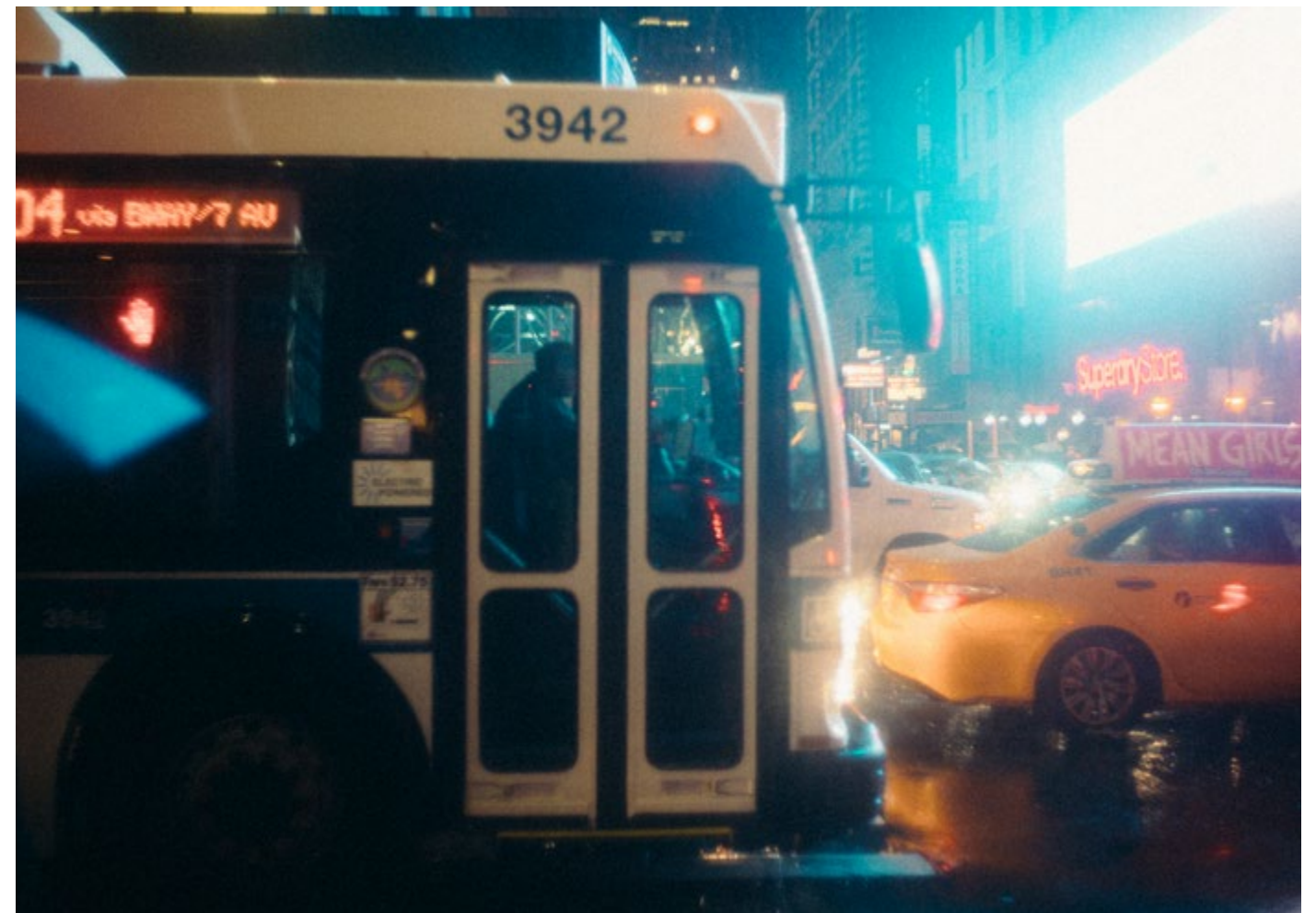
André Josselin

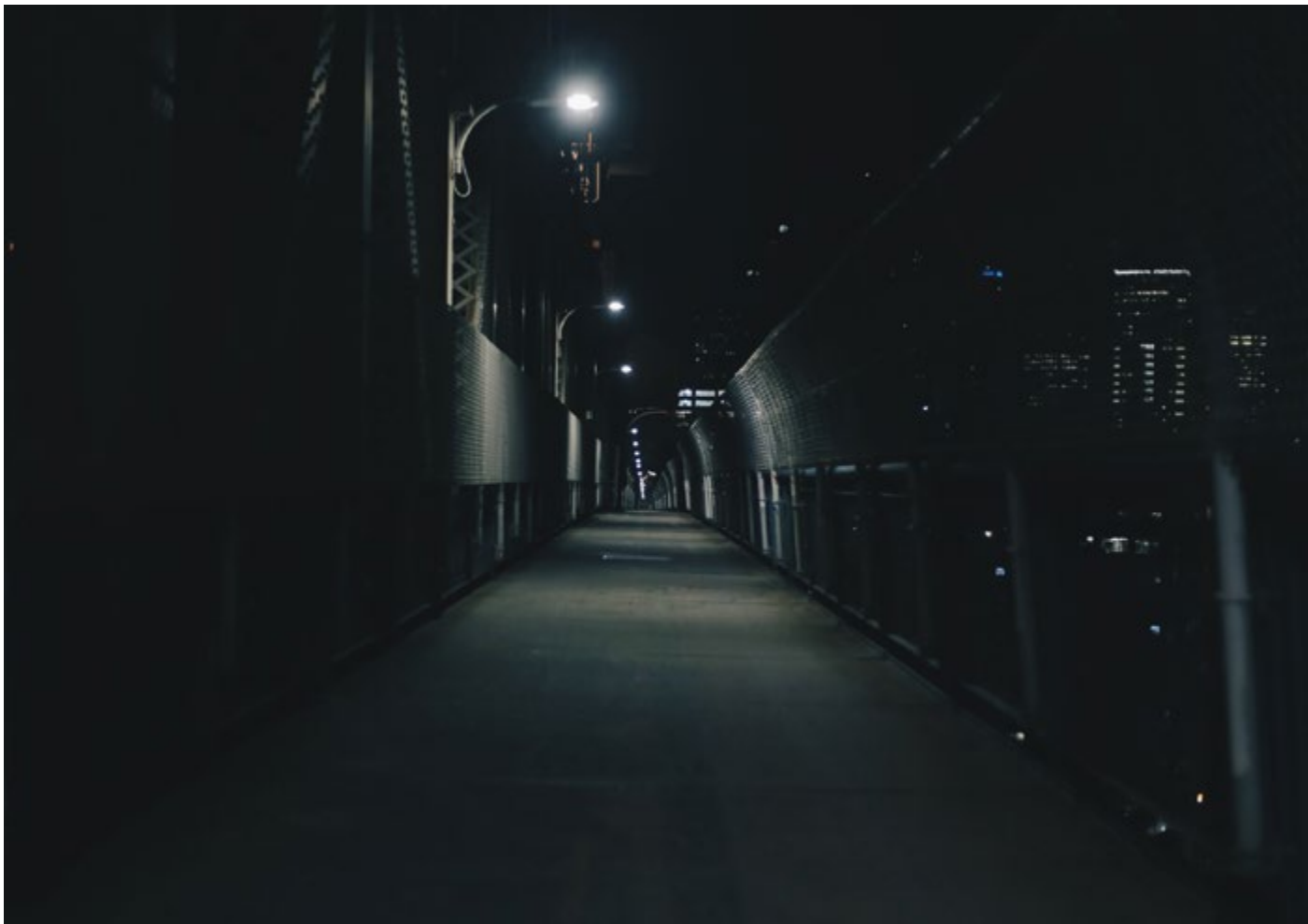
Miguel Rato

Xavier Portela

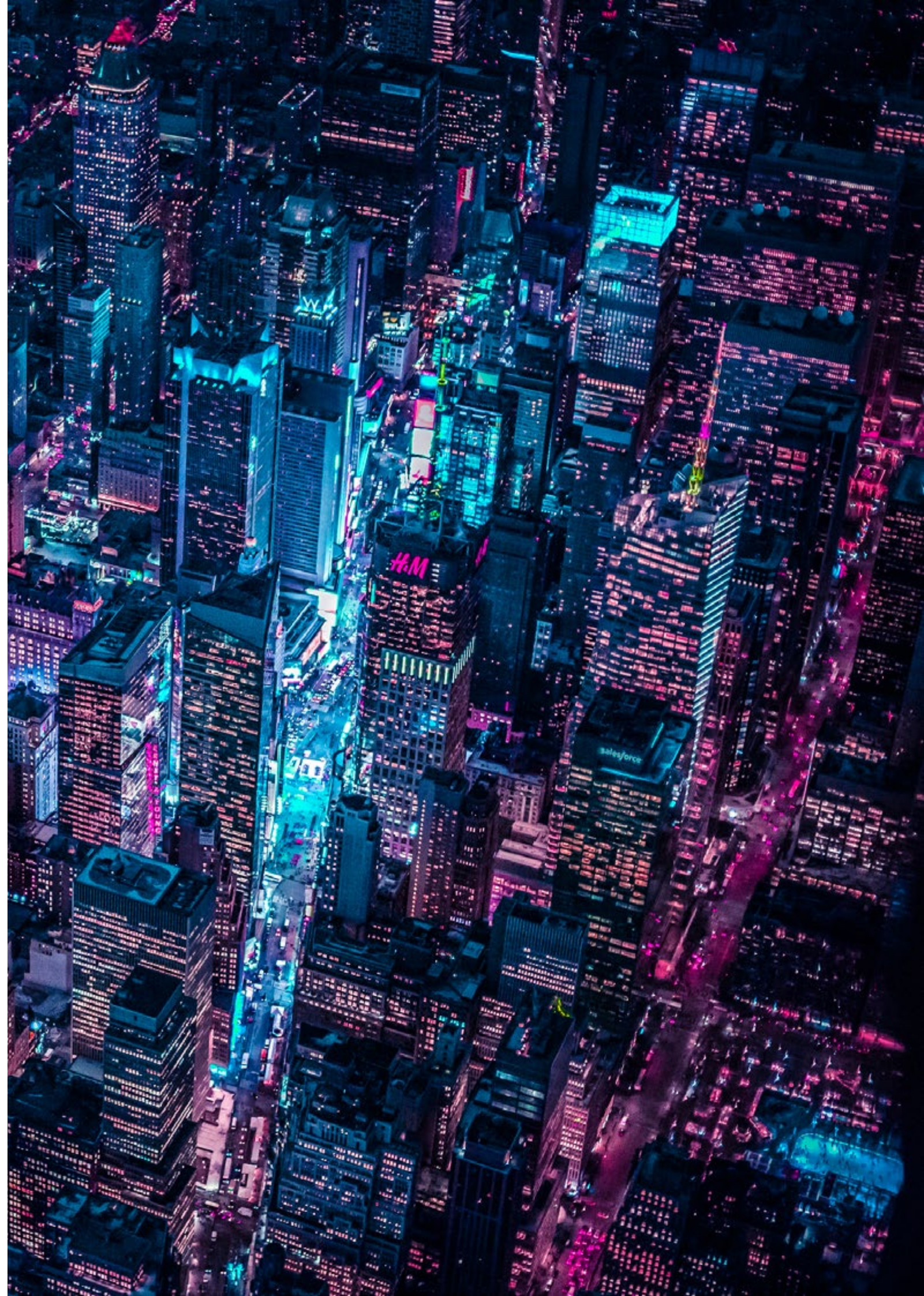

Since then he is known for his visual onslaught of signs and neon lights series: "Glow" where he suggests a new layer of colours, enabling the viewer to feel the vibrancy and atmosphere of the location.

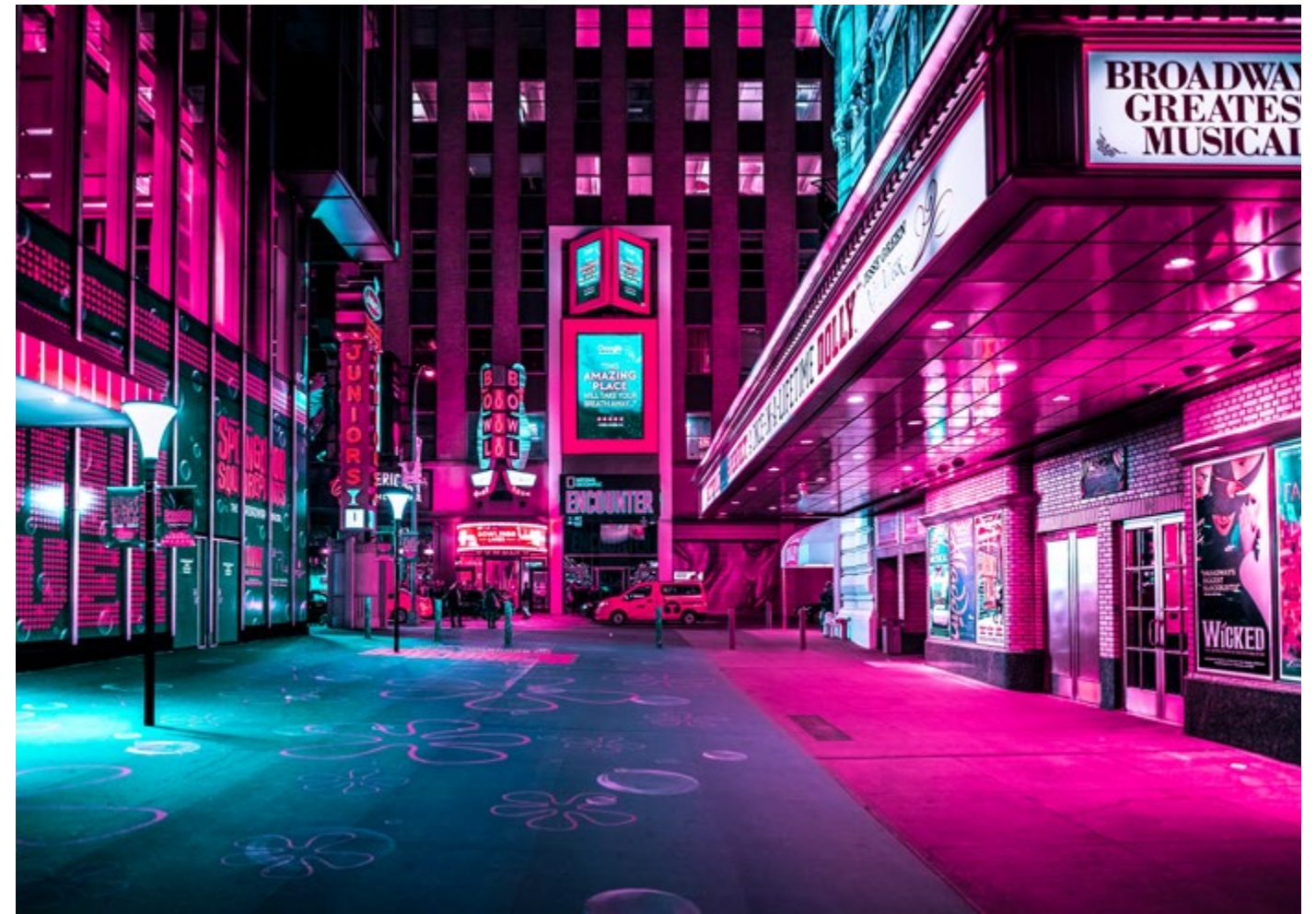
Since I started the Glow series I really wanted to add one of my favorite city in the world: New York. After Tokyo, Hong Kong and Bangkok here is New York Glow, showcasing night photographs from Times Square. So it was my sixth times in New York over the last ten years and I wanted to catch it from another point of view. So a friend of mine put me in contact with an helicopter pilot and we went for an hour of flight over Manhattan at Sunset. New York is probably the greatest illustration of the shock that happen when people from everywhere in the world collide with each other on a specific place: chaotic, noisy and so ambitious. Over the last ten years I've been six times to Manhattan, it feels more like home than home, it's kind of like a temple where I can find inspiration and peace. I usually try to go once a year to catch up with friends and recharge my batteries. It's one of those places where you just stop anywhere and absorb the world passing by.

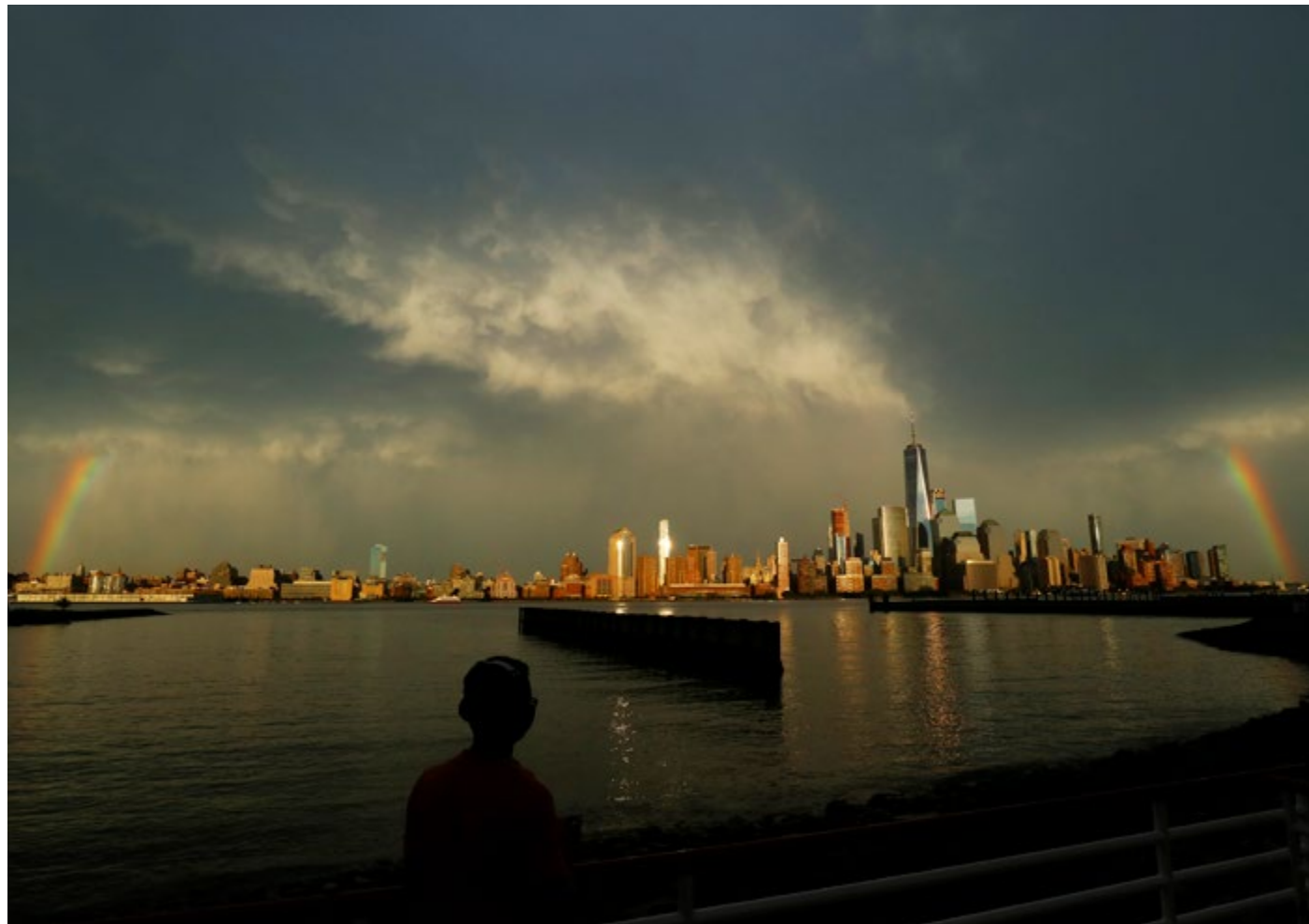

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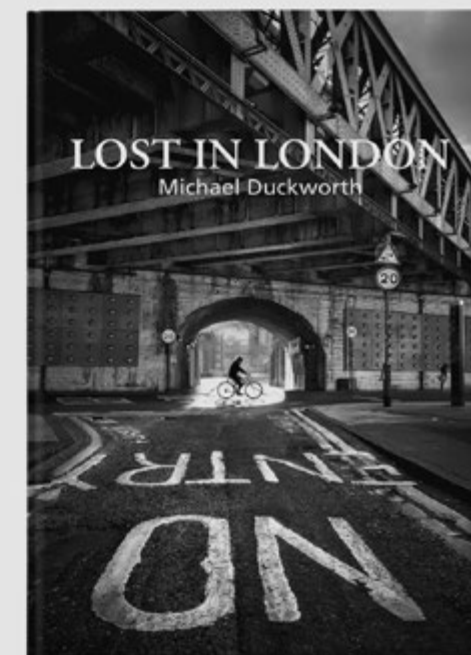
