
Carne


Beauty and Fashion








Thomas H.P. Jerusalem - MUTE

Thomas H.P. Jerusalem of MUTE Photography is a Chicago based German photographer. After living in Frankfurt, Germany and London, UK for several years, he relocated to Chicago, in 2004. Thomas H.P. Jerusalem is specialized in fashion and conceptual photography with a focus on magazine editorials and commercial work. His work has been published in the US and in international magazines including VOGUE Portugal, Italian VOGUE/PhotoVogue, FHM, ESTETICA, Dark Beauty, PLAYBOY, DODHO, Kaltblut. He is a PhotoVOGUE Gold Artist, and has been listed in the ONE LIFE 2012 Catalog and is represented by the prestigious New York agency Art+Commerce/VOGUE NYC and Motion Licensing, London UK and gallery represented with YELLOWKORNER and LemonFRAME. His childhood during the Cold War in West Germany and his father's over-sized NY Photo Academy books from the sixties influenced his style that emphasizes atmosphere and strong narrative. Thomas H.P. Jerusalem started his career with Street Photography and Photojournalism, both very expressive ways of photography that forged his distinctive sensitive approach.

Project

Nathalie Daoust

A graduate of the Cégep du Vieux in Montreal, Canadian photographer Nathalie Daoust, first caught public attention in 1999 with her surreal series New York Hotel Story. This sequence of photographs investigates the Carlton Arms Hotel's 54 uniquely decorated rooms. The resultant images establish Daoust as a photographer capable of cutting beneath the surface to expose her subject's hidden desires. Her images are portals, allowing the viewer to get a glimpse of a world divorced from reality, one that flickers from childlike wonderment to perversion.

Daoust is led by her need to understand the human impulse to construct experiences that allow us to live, at least for a moment, in a fictive world. From female dominatrices at an S&M Love Hotel in Japan in Tokyo Hotel Story, to one man's decision to discard his own identity in favor of another in Impersonating Mao, her work inhabits the liminal space between fiction and truth. Her most conceptually complex project to date, Korean Dreams, explores the meaning of fantasy itself. While in North Korea she experienced the manipulation of reality on a national scale; her photographs capture the layers of forced illusion perpetuated by the North Korean government.

Employing a variety of non-digital means to address her subjects, Daoust's methods play a crucial role in communicating content. Using specialized darkroom techniques, the process of creating the image itself contributes to her conceptual explorations. She is the recipient of numerous awards, and her work has been extensively show-cased and published worldwide.

Korean Dreams

Photographer Nathalie Daoust's newest project, Korean Dreams, is a complex series that probes the unsettling vacuity of North Korea. Piercing its veil with her lens, these images reveal a country that seems to exist outside of time, as a carefully choreographed mirage. Daoust has spent much of her career exploring the chimeric world of fantasy: the hidden desires and urges that compel people to dream, to dress up, to move beyond the bounds of convention and to escape from reality. With Korean Dreams she is exploring this escapist impulse not as an individual choice, but as a way of life forced upon an entire nation.

Daoust deliberately obscures her photographs during the development stage, as the layers of film are peeled off, the images are stifled until the facts become 'lost' in the process and a sense of detachment from reality is revealed. This darkroom method mimics the way information is transferred in North Korea – the photographs, like the North Korean people, are both manipulated until the underlying truth is all but a blur. The resultant pictures speak to North Korean society, of missing information and concealed truth.



Nico Brons

Nico Brons' application to Fotoacademie Amsterdam in 2011 was not planned. He was 54 at the time. After working in IT for years he suddenly found himself at home facing a severe disease. A dark and troubling period until he realised that he needed to be in the driver's seat. Nico made an impulsive decision and registered for Fotoacademie Amsterdam.

In 2013 he was the first to graduate with images taken by Iphone. A daring project in the conservative world of photography. As a passionate photographer, Nico has specialised in portaits, interior photography, festival and concert registration and documentary work. His intuition leads him towards the photos. "Getting touched through the lens, I'm alert for the moment. It's all about picturing the emotion at the right time." Nico's work demonstrates excellent composition and his portraits are "close to the bone".


As the result of an accident, he can only see with one eye. He believes this is a benefit as he states, "I don't have to translate the 3D reality into a 2D picture. I don't see depth, so I already have a 2D view on the world." In a short time Nico has gained acknowledgement in Europe and overseas with his photography. His IphoneArt had been exhibited in New York, Los Angeles, Melbourne and Toronto.

"The endless applications of a smartphone give me all the freedom and opportunities to create images straight from my imagination. Sometimes dark, sometimes controversial, sometimes with a slight sense of humor. Images that blur boundaries between photography and art."
