

Catastrophic climate events, such as flooding, droughts and heatwaves will become the new normal. The apocalypse is about to begin. "8:37 – Strategies to Save the World", a joint project of photographer and writer Frank Lassak and visual artist Rubica von Streng, both based in Berlin, focuses on what the name implies: various ways of how humans can adapt to a changing and increasingly hostile environment, while maintaining the spirit of humanity. The first part of the project, called, "8:37 Prologue – Facing the Future", deals with enhanced body features, shown in five printed and over-painted photographic portraits, and was produced with members of the performance collective Bipølar, Berlin.


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


The project is about the connection between places and the past, between memory and landscapes, and about trees that silently remind us that the past is never gone. While language often tends to text over external and internal reality, photography leaves a gap through which one can look at that which eludes words. For me, photography is an almost therapeutic way of dealing with the ambiguity of the world. However, this series explores the relationship between landscape and memory. On the one hand, traumatic events, rarely remembered, have left cracks, fissures, even physical scars in the landscape that transform the present. Such often idyllic places, remembering evil events, can preserve an uneasiness similar to the symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder. On the other hand, landscapes can evoke traumatic images in memory while simultaneously calming them. The series asks what can be learned from landscapes about trauma and recovery. Many of the shown photographs were taken at places that have been sites of crimes or battlefields in the past. Thus, the photographs depict landscape not only as something visible, but as permeated and shaped by the invisible - whether the invisible manifests itself in the form of a buried past or as a projection of one's own memories and soul landscape.



The figure in the photo is Ph.D Ha Thanh Van, a researcher in the intersections and transformations of various cultures. She breaks free from the mold of a typical researcher by adopting uncon- ventional clothing and playfully posing in public places, even in serious settings. Her outfits and accessories sometimes harmonize, and at other times contrast with the context in terms of colors, meanings, or dressing norms. She aims to bring joy to herself and inspire those around her, especially after the world has endured much pain and loss during the Covid-19 pandemic. Looking at her calm expression, sometimes hidden behind dark glasses, viewers become curious and question the true identity of a person always concealed beneath different attires, like layers of external shells.

Does fashion hold any significance in reinforcing or diminishing faith and the value of life? Or does it merely blind people in a consumerist society? A series of questions are raised, ultimately circling back to eternal human inquiries, yet each person has a different interpretation: Who are we, where do we come from, where are we heading, and what is the true essence of humanity? Fashion icon Yves Saint Laurent once said, "Over the years, I have come to understand that the importance of an outfit lies in the woman who will wear it." Perhaps her choice of attire in public places and cultural venues is her way of expressing her life's message and honoring cultural diversity.
