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

Aaron Sehmar is a Fine Art & Fashion photographer from the UK.





SERIES: LIFE CYCLE OF A BUTTERFLY




About the photographer



"For Mauro" is a very emotional image to me. I created it a few weeks after my brother passed away. Every element in this image has special meaning to me, i.e. from the colour of my dress, to the prop, how I am holding the prop, the location, the sunset and the 2 birds flying overhead. My brother was so brave. In hearing about his fate, he accepted it with great courage. He was satisfied in the belief that he had lived his life to the full and that he was content. I am sure there are very few of us that could say this. A great lesson to be learnt. My brother and I had a complicated relationship. The fact that we are both as stubborn as ever, both born under the Taurus star sign and both with the same Italian blood, it was always going to be a dangerous cocktail. But despite the sparks that flew around between us, I always had so much admiration and love for him. I would do just about anything for him – and he sure threw a few strange requests my way over the years. I am grateful for the chance to have connected again with him in his final weeks and for the quality time we got to spend together. It was humbling to have spent his last moments with him.

About the photographer

Margherita Introna is a fine art photographer from Cape Town, South Africa. She began self-portraiture purely for practical and convenience reasons, but soon found it to be a whole genre in its own right. What it gave back to her in return though was so much more. She found a means of expression. This is her way of healing her heartbreak and celebrating her joy. Margherita pours her heart and soul into her images. Through creating images in a world from a different time, one far more whimsical and fairy-tale than our own, the emotions conveyed are easier to bear. A dream world, where those dreams become tangible. Most of her portfolio is self-portraiture as in most instances her work is autobiographical in nature. These are her stories and her emotions. However, on occasion she also photographs models – specifically those in need of sharing their stories or emotions. Margherita's work is not merely a photograph. She prefers to think of it as creating images. Taking various photographs from her camera, then blends them together, adding texture and magic.

CORPS ET ÉTOFFES Photography by Marion Gautier



SERIES: BENEATH THE SURFACE

These are the worlds filled with hopes and desires, unfulfilled dreams, revelations and disappointments, about people and their masks, changes, transformation and new beginnings. These odd and mystic worlds and creatures tell us rather simple, yet complicated stories from life.

About the photographer

Nikolina Petolas is a conceptual photographer and digital artist from Zagreb, Croatia. She expresses her eerie visions through screenshots of an imagined story. She guides the viewer on a journey through the frames and visual interpretations of her fictional worlds. Inspired by fantasy surreal environments as well as experimental music she enjoyes creating strange surroundings and atmospheres filled with mysterious events and characters. Her motives are sometimes dark and gloomy and often present dreamlike ambients and monstruous creatures. She personifies them with her state of consciousness, inner conflicts and excessive dreamy nature. She finds inspiration in her surroundings as well as her vivid dreams and loves to give them surreal meanings. She found the way to present her daydreaming in a realistic manner, through genuine photographic textures and authentic components. Nikolina uses photography as a main tool for her artworks, although she often combines it with other digital techinques. She takes photos on a daily basis and has an immense database from which she chooses the ones that are appropriate for her artworks. She then combines specific photographic fragments into complex montage until she gets a realistic scenery. She often uses selfportraits as characters within her visual stories and therefore becomes an interactive narrator, a storyteller who guides a viewer through her fantasy landscapes.

ECOLOGICAL SEASONS OF FASHION

Photography by Stanislav Pokhodilo

The series consists of 4 photos and is a collaboration between photographer Stanislav Pokhodilo and fashion & hair designer Nataliya -Alexandra Makhortova. Each photo represents a season, in which surreal ecological fashion is shown. The clothing is made out of unusual natural products: Makhortova's crowns and corset are made of human hair, which have been dyed via a secret family recipe. The dresses are made of water and milk, with the technique of Pokhodilo. To properly shoot the photos, a whole team was needed. They created a platform in Pokhodilo's studio, where the models could stand on. After the models were prepared by the artists and the extra attributes were ready, they started shooting. The models took on one pose and - with the help of photographer Marco Leertouwer – were topped with milk, on different places on their bodies. With the new technique by Pokhodilo, several pictures were taken and then - including original background photos – were photoshopped into one piece by Pokhodilo himself. Later on creative writer Sita Veenstra was asked to give the series a story and name(s): "Ecological seasons of fashion" - a collaboration between two worlds, creating one new.

About the photographer

Stanislav Pokhodilo is an Ukrainian photographer, settled in the Netherlands. Inspired by A. Razoomovsky, Pokhodilo created his own technique, which allows liquids to "freeze". He was a finalist in "Child Photo Competition", has been nominated several times, has won the 9th annual International Color Awards & MIFA and has been published in "Dark Beauty Magazine" and "1x.com" Gallery.

TEUN VAN DER ZALM Digital Art

In the last quarter of 2013, Teun van der Zalm began his journey in the particle realm. Many opportunities confronted him. During this period he was learning about physics in nature and began to implement these in the computer.

If you look at his early work, he tested different ways to present these particles. For example the image called "In the Wake". Inspired by the song of the band King Crimson, Teun tried to create a abstract to surrealistic render of Poseidon swinging with his hands from left to right. The flow of the particles give the image a more water feeling. By presenting the particles on a black canvas, you can fully focus on the forms and flows. In "Statue" he used the particles in a very different way. By creating a simple particle flow on a white canvas, he wants to only show the physics of the particles.

His purpose was to explore the beauty of particles presented in a dot form. Therefore to show different physics with only the core element. After he explored more possibilities, his next goal was to use the particles as a source to create nature in it's pure form. Meaning a group of particles could be presented for example as a nebula.

In the second quarter of 2015, Teun began to research an new project; "What lies beyond the edge of the Observable Universe?". He began an experiment to visualize this through our universal language: Mathematics.

After testing complicated algorithms, he arrived at the Perlin Noise algorithm. This algorithm was invented in 1983 (his birth year) by Ken Perlin and was later used by several computer programs.

While experimenting with the noise algorithm, he find out that this was not good enough for the base of the nebula system. Therefore he had to use multiple and different noise fields to produce a more life like nebula form. It became clear through experiments that he needed a starting point to build on. First he created an primal object designed by a procedural algorithm. After that he transformed the object to particles and manipulate these with the noise algorithm. The result is the base nebula without all the detail.

In the second phase he deforms the base through maps that are based on fractal noise. The final result is an high dense and high detailed particle system. This way he can create close up, medium and total shots of the nebula.

While creating new beautiful visions of physics and physics in nature, Teun wants the audience to think about these forms. They can be in space far beyond the eye can see or just on earth for example falling snow or clouds. Everyting has a purpose and meaning. To see these things sometimes you have to show it in a different way.




